From basic needs like food, clothing, showers, and laundry to crucial support in legal aid, medical care, and family reunification. This one-stop-SHOP aids in rehab, housing, obtaining IDs, and SNAP applications, truly embodying its mission to connect individuals to vital resources.

Healing House understands trauma's spectrum and offers behavioral and supportive services to help adult women heal and rebuild. Through holistic programs like "Elevate," they offer services such as counseling and housing. "Genesis" assists atrisk young women aged 18-24 in adulthood transition. And the "Minority Impact Initiative" focuses on minority mental health, addressing generational trauma and breaking stigmas.

WVBPF provides invaluable resources for LGBTQ+ communities of color. The drop-in zen relaxation space is a haven from distractions and a place for solace. Their Clothing Closet offers essentials like clothing and baby items. Their Peer Mentoring fosters open communication, including the WV Buddies program for life guidance. They also host enlightening discussions on Black LGBTQ2+ history. All services are free to everyone.





Keep Your Faith Corporation is in the final stages of opening its West Side Market at Central and Park Ave, preparing to supply the community with fresh local produce and staples. Through KYFC's program West Side Grown, they advocate healing through nutrition and agriculture. Additionally, KYFC enriches the community with extensive mental health, financial empowerment, and counseling services tailored for diverse groups.



Turan Rush

Turan graduated from Capital High School in 2017. Due to an injury, he had to sit out his junior year of high school football. Turan enrolled at Antelope Valley Community College before transferring to Eastern Michigan University on a full scholarship to play defensive end. In 2021, he became first in his family to graduate college, and is now studying for his Masters in Sports Science at WV State University. As the defensive coordinator. Turan helped West Side Middle School's undefeated football team win the 2022 championship.

He says the foundation of the team's success is the **Midian Leadership Project**. Turan cofounded the group as COO with several classmates to create a system for younger students built on Transformative Community Leadership practices. The team trains at the fresh new gym at the Midian Safe Haven, their latest youth center.



"We made a vow to each other that we was all gonna graduate... That was our goal, we held each other accountable and made it happen... We knew a lot of people in our community before us had the talent, had the gifts, but ended up taking the wrong path due to a lot of things... I'm all about giving my time, giving the knowledge I have to be able to help another kid get to the next level."





Coffee enthusiasts flock to Mea Cuppa Lounge to experience owner Venu Menon's artful blends and exotic innovations tailored to local tastes. Before the weather cools, try the Mazagran, a unique and refreshing fusion of iced espresso and citrus. With fresh delectable pastries and a cozy atmosphere, this lounge has cemented its place as a beloved gathering spot and remote work hub on the West Side.





This distillery recently received Double Gold Designation by the San Francisco World Spirits Competition after only just opening in 2021. The team distills its vodka and moonshine right here on the West Side, and partners with others to crafts its gin, rye, and bourbon whiskey. The team says what sets its drinks apart from the competition is the Greenbrier County limestone cavewater it uses for dilution.

New health center on West Side coming soon...



By summer of 2024, Cabin Creek Health Systems is set to open its most comprehensive health center vet on Ohio Ave in the former Kroger/USPS building on the West Side.

The Westside Health Center (working title) will house 12 primary care rooms, 2 behavioral generalists, 1 psychiatric room, and 5 dental chairs. Its sliding scale care will allow patients without Medicaid to pay what they can afford based on their income. Additionally, its 340b pharmacy means affordable drugs will be available closeby, and its CARP program will be there for substance users in treatment.

lake Van Horn, Cabin Creek's community impact officer, is gathering input from locals in order to best personalize care as the neighborhood needs it.

"It could be 'I work nine to five and get zero days off, and so I can't get there. Or I don't have a car, and I have to travel all the way across town to talk to someone about my respiratory health because the PCP I see down the street doesn't do emphysema," Van Horn said.
